Measuring the impact of SPG spending

Children have developed skills and confidence in a wide range of sports through the professional coaching in school from Education Enterprise.

All pupils have had opportunities to participate in inter school festivals and competitions using the Sports Premium funding.

The profile of sport has increased in school and all children participate in a range of sporting activities each week, developing skills, teamwork and an understanding of the benefits of physical activity.

Staff have worked alongside professional coaches to develop their skills in delivering high quality PE.

The school had a very successful year in sporting competitions reaching Level 3 (the regional final) in the Sainsbury's Tag Rugby competition. The football team won both the Teesdale Small Schools' Tournament and the Woodland Football Tournament.
