### **Curriculum focus of PPG spending in 2016/17**

To narrow the gap for specific groups of children who are vulnerable to possible underachievement. These include pupils who are entitled to free school meals, those looked after by the local authority and the children of armed services personnel.

To ensure specific supported programmes are implemented and professional development is undertaken to ensure quality provision for children requiring intervention.

To support pupils with movement difficulties.

To ensure all children have access to extra-curricular and enrichment opportunities.

### **Measuring the impact of PPG spending**

Children who qualified for Pupil Premium in Year 6 achieved broadly in line with their peers.

Tracking shows that children who were eligible for Pupil Premium achieved good progress in the year 2016-17.

Tracking shows that progress and attainment are in line with non-Pupil Premium children.

PP and EYPP attendance in line with the school average of 97%.

All children eligible for Pupil Premium participate in school clubs, trips and residential visits.

Positive parent feedback at parents meetings.

Updates to school governors at Curriculum and Standards meetings and the Full Governing Body meetings.

Governors monitored impact of Pupil Premium spending in school.
