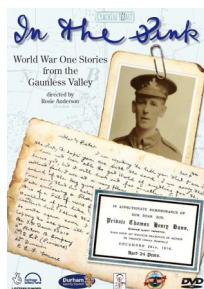

Hamsterley Forest: Dulce Et Decorum Est

Three County Durham youth theatres Jackass, Turrets & WASH bring local stories of WW1 to life in this outdoor immersive theatre performance working in collaboration with acclaimed theatre company Burn the Curtain and local professional artists, actors and musicians who live and work in Teesdale and Weardale.

Young people will use the pathways and clearings of Hamsterley Forest to weave a web of stories and songs, taking the audience on a journey, sharing tales of the men, women and children from across County Durham who served in the Great War

Please note, there are two different walks for this show:

Volunteer: This walk is designed to challenge you. Volunteers will be walking on the less used paths of the forest so is suitable for those who have a reasonable level of fitness.

Conscript: This walk is designed to be accessible for those with access needs or those that would like a more leisurely walk.
