Spending Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low income families who are currently known to be eligible for FSM in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months.

The Government has decided that eligibility for the Pupil Premium in 2012-13 will be extended to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years.

During 2011/2012 Woodland Primary School chose to spend Pupil Premium for individual pupils on the following:

- Covering the charges for clubs and extended school activities.
- Early intervention groups across the key stages.
- Additional teaching support for Numeracy and Literacy.
- Small Family Learning groups aimed at enhancing Early Literacy Skills through reading and writing activities.
- Family Learning groups linked to Motor Skills/ concentration
- Parent / family support work, engaging parents.
- Toe by Toe materials and TA intervention time.
- SATs Club

The additional intervention put into place made a major contribution to the progress made in Reading, Writing and Maths by the eligible children.

The School Improvement Action Plan for 2012/2013 clearly identifies further development of all of the above for the coming year and will be updated on an ongoing basis. Early intervention e.g. one to one tuition and booster groups after school, will continue to be a key element in our improvement strategy.
