To support pupils to develop emotional resilience.

To ensure all children have access to extra-curricular and enrichment opportunities.

Children who qualify for Early Years Pupil Premium in EYFS make good progress in line with their peers.

Tracking shows that children who were eligible for Pupil Premium achieve good progress in the year 2018-19.

100% of children qualifying for Pupil Premium made good progress.

All children qualifying for PP with no additional needs achieved ARE/ARE+.

Tracking shows that progress and attainment are in line with non-Pupil Premium and Early Years Pupil Premium children.

Children achieved in line with their peers.

PP and EYPP attendance in line with the school average of 97%.

Attendance for PP children was 98.6%.

All children eligible for Pupil Premium participate in school clubs, trips and residential visits.

100% involvement in all school activities including residential visits.

Positive parent feedback at parents' meetings.

95% parents agreed that their child enjoyed school and made good progress. (Survey Autumn 2018)

Special interest governors monitor impact of Pupil Premium and Early Years Pupil Premium spending in school.
